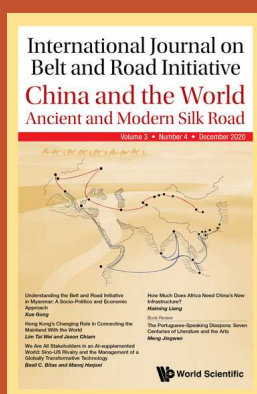

Dr. Joanna Lei

Dr. Joanna Lei began her career as a communication scholar at the University of Pennsylvania in early 1980's. From 1987-96, she worked in the media conglomerate Capital Cities/ABC Inc. in New York. She was later promoted to Vice President/Director, then the highest ranking Asian in mainstream American media.

From 1997-2002, Joanna served as an Investment Partner in Baring Communication Equity Asia, Singapore. Her investment activities covered telecom, media and technology in the Asian Pacific region excluding Japan. Since repatriating to Taiwan in 2000, Dr. Joanna Lei has been elected Senator and appointed Chairman of a government-owned enterprise KKL. In addition to serving as the Chairperson of the National Women's League, she currently holds many corporate board positions in Taiwan and chairs the board of a Hong Kong listed company.

Dr. Joanna Lei received her B.A. from the National Taiwan University. Her M.A. and Ph.D are from the Annenberg School for Communication, University of Pennsylvania.

Prof. Da Hsuan Feng is currently the Honorary Dean of Hainan University Belt and Road Research Institute and the Chief Advisor of China Silk Road iValley Research Institute. He grew up in Singapore and received his physics PhD from the University of Minnesota (1972). He was the M Russell Wehr Chair Professor of Drexel University and served as the United States National Science Foundation Program Director in Theoretical Physics. Since 2002, Feng had taken roles as the Vice President for Research at the University of Texas at Dallas, the Senior Vice President of National Cheng Kung University, National Tsing Hua University in Taiwan, and Special Advisor to the Rector and Director of Global Strategies of Macau University. He is the author of the book *China's Millennium Transformation, the Belt and Road Initiative*, published by World Scientific Publishing.
